Rules and General Information

- Entries accepted 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 13, 2023
- Judging from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., or until judging is completed
- No entry fee
- Location is Tulsa Garden Center Mansion, 2435 S Peoria Ave, Tulsa OK 74114
- All classes are open to amateur growers or arrangers. Only one exhibitor or team from one garden may enter any one class.

Entry Guidelines

- Judging will follow the American Rose Society guidelines and the official scale of points.
- Exhibitors may enter as many blooms as desired in each class, of different varieties, except as noted.
- Entries must have official ARS entry tags furnished by the Tulsa Rose Society.
- With the exception of seedlings, sports, and the Unnamed Landscape Classes, rose varieties are to be exhibited by the recognized American exhibition name (AEN). In every case of conflict between these sources the latest one published shall take precedence. The online Modern Roses database is the most up to date ARS publication and takes precedence over all other publications. The following is the list of official ARS publications listing Approved Exhibition Names: Modern Roses, Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Exhibitors & Judges, Handbook for Selecting Roses, Recent Registrations on the ARS website, and the online Modern Roses database. In cases where a variety is not listed in any of the above official ARS publications, the Combined Rose List (CRL) or Help Me Find (HMF) may be used as a reference.
- This is an alphabetical show. With the exception of classes specifying multiple varieties, all roses in each class will be placed alphabetically and each variety in each class shall constitute a separate class to be judged separately.
- Containers will be furnished by the Tulsa Rose Society unless noted.
- Horticulture Division entries will be disqualified for the following reasons:
 - 1. Misnamed A misnamed entry must be disqualified.
 - 2. Unlabeled or Mislabeled is a disqualification.
 - 3. Exhibitor's Name Visible During Judging is a disqualification.
 - 4. Roses Not Outdoor Grown and/or Not Grown by the Exhibitor Roses must be disqualified.
- Misplaced. A misplaced entry is neither disqualified nor penalized, no matter who was responsible for the misplacement. Misclassed Entries that contain an incorrect class on the entry tag shall, if practical, be moved to the proper class and judged. Additional explanation can be found in Chapter 4 of the ARS Guidelines and Rules for Judging.
- Wedges and supports are permitted. An entry may be penalized if wedging material extends above the top of the vase according to its degree of distraction.

- No exhibits can be removed prior to the closing of the show. Keeper trophies may be taken following the Judges' Luncheon.
- Exhibitors must place their challenge class entries in Horticulture.
- During judging, only judges, clerks, and necessary show personnel will be allowed in the show area.
- Neither the Tulsa Rose Society nor Tulsa Garden Center will be responsible for the loss or damage to any property, nor for injury to persons. Liability of any nature is disclaimed.
- There shall be no communication of any results of this show to anyone, whether by electronic means or otherwise, until the judging is complete, and the Chair of Judges has declared the results final.

<u>Awards</u>

- First, second, and third place rankings may be awarded in each class.
- American Rose Society Gold, Silver and Bronze certificates will be awarded in Hybrid Tea/Grandiflora, Miniflora, and Miniature for the Queen, King, and Princess of Show.
- ARS Certificates will be awarded in the classes stated in the show schedule to the best blueribbon winners.
- Keeper trophies will be awarded to ARS Certificate winners and challenge class blue ribbon winners.
- Best of Show—All exhibits in Horticulture are eligible for this award. Selection will be by the final judging panel following selection of all certificate and blue-ribbon winners.

DIVISION I: HORTICULTURAL SPECIMENS

SECTION A: HYBRID TEAS, GRANDIFLORAS, AND OTHER LARGE ROSES

Class 1 Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras, and their Climbing Counterparts

One bloom per stem, no side buds. Entries will be classed alphabetically, classes A to Z. Eligible for Queen, King, and Princess of Show.

Award: Certificates and Keeper trophy for King, Queen, and Princess. Court of Honor: Next 7 best roses

Class 2 Fully Open Hybrid Teas, Grandifloras, and their Climbing Counterparts

One bloom per stem, no side buds, stamens must show. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy.

Class 3 Floribunda Sprays and Climbing Counterparts

Two or more blooms. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 4 Climbing Varieties

Not sport or bush types, naturally grown. One bloom per stem or spray with two or more blooms to a stem. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 5 Floribundas and Climbing Counterparts

One bloom per stem, no side buds. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 6 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Sprays and Climbing Counterparts

Two or more blooms per stem. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 7 Polyantha Sprays and Climbing Counterparts

Two or more blooms per stems. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 8 Fragrance Award

Open to any type of rose. Rose is judged on 70% fragrance and 30% horticulture excellence. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 9 Dowager Queen

Old Garden Roses or Species Roses, introduced prior to 1867, including roses with unknown dates known to be in existence prior to 1867.

One bloom or spray with two or more blooms, naturally grown or disbudded.

It is suggested that the date of introduction appear on the entry tag.

Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 10 Victorian Queen

Old Garden Rose or Species Rose, introduced in 1867 or later, or with unknown introduction date not fitting the qualifications for Class 9, naturally grown or disbudded, one bloom or spray with two or more blooms.

Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 11 Classic Shrub

Classified by ARS as Hybrid Kordesii, Hybrid Moyesii, Hybrid Musk, Hybrid Rugosa. One bloom or spray with two or more blooms. Exception: The hybrids of H. moyesii have a family designation in Modern Roses 12, but in the Handbook, they are listed as S and are to be entered as Modern Shrubs.

Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 12 Modern Shrub

No family designations. Includes class listed as Shrub only. One bloom or spray with two or more blooms. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 13 Genesis and Species, and Roses Classified as Species

Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 14 Austin Roses

Only varieties hybridized by David Austin. May exhibit as single bloom, spray, or inflorescence

Class 15 Best of the Best of Shrubs

May include varieties listed as classic shrubs, modern shrubs, and Austin classes. Entries will be classed alphabetically. Eligible for Queen, King, and Princess of Show. Award: Keeper trophy for King, Queen, and Princess. Court of Honor: Next 7 best roses

Class 16 Unnamed Landscape Rose

One bloom or spray with two or more blooms of any large rose. Award: Keeper Trophy

SECTION B: LARGE CHALLENGE CLASSES

Class 17 President's Choice

Two different Earth Kind roses, single bloom or spray of any color, displayed in one or more containers. Your container or TRS provided. List of Earth Kind roses on last page of this schedule. Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 18 Large English Box

Six large roses of any kind (may include Hybrid Tea, Floribunda, Shrub, Climber, Grandiflora, or any other large rose, excluding miniature and miniflora), no foliage to show, displayed in an English box provided by the Tulsa Rose Society. Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 19 Rose in a Bowl

Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora at Exhibition stage, floating in container furnished by the Tulsa Rose Society.

Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 20 Rose in a Bowl

Any large rose except Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora (may include FL, shrubs, including David Austin, and OGR's) floating in container furnished by the Tulsa Rose Society.

Class 21 Non-Exhibition Form – Hybrid Tea

Any Hybrid Tea of general variety that does not have exhibition form (i.e. has fully open form of bloom)

Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 22 Rose in a Frame

One Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora (may also include FL, shrubs and OGR's) in exhibition stage. Frames provided by Tulsa Rose Societ Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 23 Bouquet

Any combination of Old Garden Roses and Shrub Roses. Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 24 Earth Kind or Griffith Buck Shrub Rose

Exhibited as a single bloom or spray. Rose must be included in the current list of Earth kind or Griffith Buck list. List of Earth Kind roses on last page of this schedule.

Class 25 New Seedlings and Sports

Seedling rose or any hybridized rose according to registered definition or found by exhibitor, not yet introduced into commerce.

SECTION C: MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA ROSES

Class 26 Miniature

One bloom per stem, no side buds, includes climbing types, exhibition form. Eligible for Queen, King, Princess, and Court (7).

Award: ARS Certificates and Keeper Trophies for Queen, King, and Princess.

Class 27 Miniflora

One bloom per stem, no side buds, includes climbing types, exhibition form. Eligible for Queen, King, Princess, and Court (7).

Award: ARS Certificates and Keeper Trophies for Queen, King, and Princess.

Class 28 Miniature Spray

One stem with two or more blooms per stem. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 29 Miniature or Miniflora Fully Open

One bloom, fully open, stamens showing. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 30 Miniature or Miniflora Single Bloom

One bloom with 5-12 petals. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 31 Rose in a Bowl - Miniature or Miniflora

Rose fully open, stamens must show, floating in clear water. No stem or foliage. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 32 Micro-Miniature Rose

Exhibition stage, one bloom per stem, no side buds. Award: Keeper Trophy

SECTION D: MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA CHALLENGE CLASSES

Class 33 John Carter Miniflora Tribute

One Miniflora Spray, two or more blooms per stem Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 34 Miniature or Miniflora English Box

Six rose blooms, one or more varieties at exhibition stage. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 35 Artist Palette – Miniature or Miniflora

Five blooms, either all miniflora or all miniature, exhibition stage, five different varieties, no foliage to show.

Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 36 Rose in a Bowl - Miniature or Miniflora

Rose in exhibition stage floating in clear water. No stem or foliage. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 37 Rose in a Frame – Miniature or Miniflora

One miniature or miniflora rose in a frame, exhibition stage. Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 38 Matched Pair - Miniature or Miniflora

Same variety of roses, one bloom per stem, exhibition stage, shown in separate containers. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy Eligible

SECTION E: JUDGES' CHALLENGE

Class 39 Single Entry - Large Rose

Any classification other than miniature or miniflora, one bloom per stem, any variety. Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 40 Single Entry - One Miniature or Miniflora Rose

One bloom per stem, exhibition form. No Singles. Award: Keeper Trophy

SECTION F: NOVICE CLASSES AND YOUTH CLASSES

Open to anyone not having won a blue ribbon in an American Rose Society Show. Exhibitors may enter either regular competitive classes or novice classes, but not the same varieties in both classes.

Class 41 Novice Large Roses

Includes all classes of large roses such as Hybrid Teas, Grandiflora, Climbers, English or Shrub Roses, one bloom per stem, no side buds.

Award: ARS Certificate and Keeper Trophy

Class 42 Novice Miniature or Miniflora

One bloom per stem, no side buds Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 43 Novice Unnamed Landscape Rose

One bloom or spray with two or more blooms of any large rose. Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 44 Youth Novice Class

Open to a novice under the age of 18. Any size or class of rose may be exhibited. Award: Keeper Trophy

Class 45 Youth Unnamed Landscape Rose

One bloom or spray with two or more blooms of any large rose. Award: Keeper Trophy

EARTH-KIND ROSES

Earth-Kind is a special designation given to select rose cultivars by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service through the Earth-Kind landscaping program. It is based on the results of extensive research and field trials and is awarded only to those roses demonstrating superior pest tolerance, combined with outstanding landscape performance.

Earth-Kind roses do well in a variety of soil types, ranging from well-drained acid sands to poorly aerated, highly alkaline clays. Once established, these select cultivars also have excellent heat and drought tolerance.

The use of Earth-Kind roses provides the opportunity to enjoy these wonderful flowering plants while limiting the use of fertilizers, pesticides, and water. These sustainable practices are excellent examples of how Earth-Kind landscaping is working to preserve and protect our natural resources and the environment.
